Employees' pay preferences have changed but payment methods have not caught up as fast. Check out the statistics below.



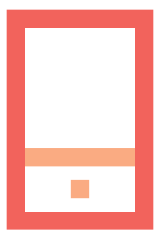
82% employers in Australia utilise direct-debit as their preferred method of payment – closely aligned with Singapore, North America and Europe.



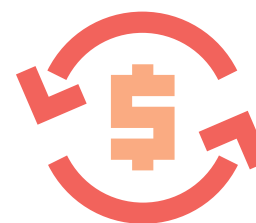
>50% employers offer non-traditional payment options across APAC. These include prepaid pay cards, mobile payment and other digital options.



72% APAC companies believe they will need to customise payment options to be competitive in the war for talent – but they want to assess the rewards and risks.



>50% APAC employees prefer prepaid cards, mobile payments over direct deposit.



62% of employees, globally, indicate that alternative pay frequencies or options would make a difference in their decision to accept a job offer.

Australian employees most **skeptical about non-traditional pay methods** dominating the landscape in next 10 years.
